General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) Privacy Notice

Who processes your information?

Beaufort Primary School and Beaufort Nursery are the data controllers of the personal information you provide to us. This means the school determines the purposes for, and the manner in which, any personal data relating to pupils and their families is to be processed. Aneesa Ali is the Data Protection Officer (DPO). The DPO's role is to oversee and monitor the school's data protection procedures, and to ensure they are compliant with the GDPR. Karen Cundy acts as a representative for the school with regard to its data controller responsibilities.

In some cases, your data will be outsourced to a third party processor e.g. external clubs; however, this will only be done with your consent, unless the law requires the school to share your data. Where the school outsources data to a third party processor, the same data protection standards that Beaufort Primary School and Beaufort Nursery upholds are imposed on the processor.

Why do we collect and use your information?

We collect and use pupil information under section 537A of the Education Act 1996, and section 83 of the Children Act 1989. We also comply with Article 6(1)(c) and Article 9(2)(b) of the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR).

Beaufort Primary School and Nursery holds the legal right to collect and use personal data relating to pupils and their families, and we may also receive information regarding them from their previous school, the Local Authority (LA) and/or the Department for Education (DfE). We collect and use personal data in order to meet legal requirements and legitimate interests set out in the GDPR and UK law, including those in relation to the following:

- Article 6 and Article 9 of the GDPR
- Education Act 1996
- Regulation 5 of the Education (Information about Individual Pupils) (England) Regulations 2013

In accordance with the above, the personal data of pupils and their families is collected and used for the following reasons:

- to support pupil learning
- to monitor and report on pupil progress
- to provide appropriate pastoral care
- to assess the quality of our service
- to comply with the law regarding data sharing
- to safeguard pupils

Which data is collected?

The categories of pupil information that the school collects, holds and shares include the following:

- Personal information (names, unique pupil number and contact details)
- Characteristics (ethnicity, language, nationality, country of birth and free school meal eligibility)
- Attendance information (sessions attended, number of absences and absence reasons)
- Assessment information (national curriculum assessment results)
- Relevant medical information
- Information relating to Special Education Needs (SEND) and/or English as an Additional Language (EAL)
- Behavioural information (number of temporary exclusions)
- Safeguarding Information

Whilst the majority of the personal data you provide to the school is mandatory, some is provided on a voluntary basis. In order to comply with GDPR the school will inform you whether you are required to provide certain pupil information to us or if your consent is needed. Where consent is required, the school will provide you with specific and explicit information with regards to the reasons the data is being collected and how the data will be used.

How long is your data stored for?

Personal data relating to pupils at Beaufort Primary School and Beaufort Nursery and their families is stored in line with the school's GDPR Data Protection Policy.

We hold your education records securely until you change school. The records will then be transferred to the new school, where they will be retained until you reach the age of 25, after which they are destroyed.

Will my information be shared?

Beaufort Primary School and Beaufort Nursery will not share your personal information with any third parties without your consent, unless the law allows us to do so. The school routinely shares pupils' information with:

- Pupils' destinations upon leaving the school
- The Local Authority (LA)
- The NHS
- The Department for Education (DfE)

We are required by law, to provide information about our pupils to the DfE as part of statutory data collections such as the school census and early years' census. Some of this information is then stored in the National Pupil Database (NPD). The law that allows this is the Education (Information about Individual Pupils) (England) Regulations 2013.

The NPD is owned and managed by the DfE and contains information about pupils in schools in England. It provides invaluable evidence on educational performance to inform independent research, as well as studies commissioned by the Department. It is held in electronic format for statistical purposes. This information is securely collected from a range of sources including schools, local authorities and awarding bodies.

The department may share information about our pupils from the NPD with third parties who promote the education or well-being of children in England by:

- Conducting research or analysis
- Producing statistics
- Providing information, advice or guidance

What are your rights?

Under data protection legislation, parents and pupils have the right to request access to information about them that we hold. To make a request for your personal information, or be given access to your child's educational records, please see the GDPR Data Protection Policy on the school's website for the request form. The school will, on an annual basis, share individual Data Collection Sheets with you in order to ensure that our records are accurate and up to date.

You also have the right to:

- Be informed about how Beaufort Primary School and Nursery uses your personal data
- Request access to the personal data that Beaufort Primary School and Nursery holds
- Request that your personal data is amended if it is inaccurate or incomplete
- Request that your personal data is erased where there is no compelling reason for its continued processing
- Request that the processing of your data is restricted
- Object to your personal data being processed.

Where the processing of your data is based on your consent, you have the right to withdraw this consent at any time.

If you have a concern about the way Beaufort Primary School and Nursery and/or the DfE is collecting or using your personal data, we ask that you raise your concern with us in the first instance.
