

## Coronavirus (COVID-19) symptoms in children

Children can get coronavirus, but they seem to get it less often than adults and it's usually less serious.

The main symptoms of COVID-19 are:

- a high temperature

- a new, continuous cough – this means coughing a lot, for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours

- a loss or change to sense of smell or taste – this means they cannot smell or taste anything, or things smell or taste different to normal

### What to do if your child has symptoms

If your child has any of the main symptoms of COVID-19, even if they're mild:

- Get a PCR test (test that is sent to a lab) to check if they have COVID-19 as soon as possible.

- Your child should stay at home and not have visitors (self-isolate) until you get the test result – they can only leave home to have the test.

- If you as a parent/carer, you will not be required to self-isolate if you live in the same household as someone with COVID-19.
